


## **Brainteasers**

### This month's puzzles

**Puzzle 1**. A riddle for a change: The Pope has it but he does not use it. Your father has it but your mother uses it. (until recently perhaps) Nuns do not need it. Arnold Schwarzenegger has a big one, Michael J. Fox's is quite small. What is it?

### Puzzle 2.

You are stuck in a room. All that is there is a slip of paper on a table, and many bottles. The only exit is guarded by a heat sensor that will not let you out. The only way out is to drink one of the bottles' contents, and the liquid will cool down your body heat (with no harm to yourself) enough so that the heat sensor doesn't detect you anymore. There are nine bottles on the ground beyond the table. The content of the slip of paper will tell you what each of the bottles are. Find out what all the bottles are, and then find out which one to drink to get out.

Three of me are poison, and will kill you if you drink. Two of me are water, nothing bad will happen with these. Two of me are wine, and it will only get you drunk. One will heat you up forever, and this room will never let you out. (hinder) Only one here will help you, it will cool down your body heat. No medium bottles are poison. Wine is bad in large doses, so none are large. Each of the end bottles have the same contents. No matter how help hides, it will be on poison's left side, but its left side is safe. No two small bottles are the same. The hinderer is harder, for it resides between wine and water. The hinder bottle is large, so it works forever. Neither big nor medium will save your life. Poison is all you will get from the bottle on the far right. Water is next to the helper.

Bottle Order: is Large-Small-Large--Medium--Small--Large--Medium--Large-Small

# **R-U-Nuts**



When fastening two things together, it is relatively easy to get information on bolt strength.

UNF (SAE) - Marked with radial lines. None – grade 2. The grade is two more than the number of lines.

3 lines- grade 5, 6 lines - grade 8.

Metric classes are marked with numbers like 8.8 or 10.9. The number before the dot is the class with class 8 roughly similar to SAE grade 5strength.



When it comes to nuts things are not so easy.

Rule of Thumb. Nuts should not be weaker than the bolt. A bit stronger should be okay. A weak nut may strip or be deformed ruining the integrity of the fastening.

Can you put a nut on backwards? The answer is yes technically, but it probably doesn't matter much. If a nut is chamfered on one side only, the flat side should go to the washer or join. For nuts chamfered both sides, one (except grade 2) should have markings. (Have you ever noticed them?) These marks are meant to go to the outside, perhaps to allow inspection. Also, if the markings disrupt the surface, that may effect torque.

### The Nut Marking systems.

Here things can get complicated with a number of different systems.

Metric, - Hopefully easy showing a little number 8 or 10 etc. SAE Grade 2 – no marks. Grade 5 Two little lines  $120^{0}$  apart. Grade 8 two lines  $60^{0}$  apart – see diagrams.

### "Clock" method(s)

This uses a dot to indicate 12 o'clock and a small radial line to show the grade. This system may also be found on metric nuts. There appears to be a couple of different ways the small radial line can be placed

I rare cases the markings may be on one of the flat hex surfaces.

There are also quite a few other systems out there. It seems that if the connection is critical, much homework is to be done.

### It is enough to drive you nuts.
