Lucas Electrics

If you have ever owned a British car (or even an Australian one) you have almost certainly had a vehicle with some connection to Lucas. For some almost anything electrical was made by them. English original home manufacturers, English Ford (e.g. Prefect), English GM (e.g. Vauxhall) all used their parts. For things like a starter motor you might find the same part across different makers and perhaps even in a Grey Fergie tractor. Lucas made Lights, Starter and Wiper motors Distributors and Coils, Horns Generators (English prefer the term Dynamo) Voltage regulators Fuse boxes. Their colour code for wiring harnesses was pretty much the standard.

Although some items may have been shared, their range was enormous. A mid-fifties catalogue for just rear lights ran into 72 pages with meticulous cross-referencing.



The Lucas 1130 Sidelight

This sidelight was used with some variations (chrome or painted, one or two filament globes and different lenses) from as early as the mid 30's until at least the mid 50's. It was used on everything from Rolls-Royce to little Austins and even some French Citroens that were assembled in the UK after WWII.

The early days :- Joseph Lucas in the 1850's was a jobless father of six selling paraffin from barrow cart. Around 1860 he formed a company making things like buckets and scoops from pressed metal. He was joined by son Harry and they started making lamps for ships. Harry designed a lamp for a bicycle that was claimed to withstand strong wind, It was given the title "King of the Road", a name used many times later.

With the advent of the motor car (a 1914 contract to supply Morris for example) and the impetus of WW1 Lucas industries grew hugely. To give some idea of the size, in 1931, ten thousand female workers went on a one week strike.

Lucas Electrics The not so serious

Lucas products have not always had a great reputation perhaps a little undeservedly as car makers were possibly cutting corners. However it provided a good source for humour, with copious references to Lucas Smoke. Here are some examples.

e Lucas motto: "Get home before dark."


Lucas – Inventor of the self-dimming headlamp.

Lucas – Inventor of the intermittent wiper.

The three position Lucas switch – Dim, Flicker and Off.

The other three switch settings-SMOKE, SMOLDER and IGNITE.

The original anti-theft device – Lucas Electrics.



Lucas is an acronym for Loose Unsoldered Connections and Splices.

Lucas systems actually uses AC current; it just has a random frequency.

Did you hear the one about the guy that peeked into a British car and asked the owner "How can you tell one switch from another at night? They all look the same." The owner replied, "It doesn't matter which one you use, nothing happens!"

Alexander Graham Bell invented the Telephone. Thomas Alva Edison invented the Light Bulb. Joseph Lucas invented the Short Circuit.

Lucas Wiring Harness Smoke

It was realised that many Lucas electrical problems were due to smoke escaping from the wiring harness,. This could be remedied by replacing the smoke so replacement smoke was made available. Such was the demand that counterfeit smoke hit the market. Below pictured is genuine on the left an beside some fake thought to be sourced from illegal waste incineration.



Some bright spark (pun intended) had kits made up with helpful tips and replies to queries. Here are some examples.

Q:'I have a fourteen year old son named Lucas who I have caught several times in the back of the garage smoking. Can I capture and use this smoke instead of the kit.?

A: Only if he lit up using sparks from a Lucas battery,

Q:I lost a lot of smoke in my Morris Minor and unfortunately some of the wiring insulation was lost. Does this product replace that as well?

A: Normally only if it is black. For wiring like the Blue/White tracer wire to headlights you will need a special order. The white smoke is not too difficult but blue needs to get our chemical engineers involved.

Q:I have been very diligent over the years and have maintained the smoke in my Sunbeam's wires perfectly. The problem is that that special Lucas perfume has disappeared from the dash, carpets and seats. In fact, at the last Concours d'Elegance I lost out to a frogeye with period odours. Is the smoke in your kit fresh enough to bring back the OEM smells of burning plastic and bakelite and are you include an adapter? A: No adapter needed, but have you tried just STARTING and running it? It might bring back the aroma by itself.

Q: Is this setup on the "metric system" or can it be used universally? I have a MB 380SL but have replaced some of the wirings with U.S. products. Will your product make the transition? Also, are there any EPA limitations on shipping?
A: This setup is Whitworth only. sorry.

Q: Can I use this device to replace the smoke in my Alfa Spider? Is Brit smoke the same as Italian smoke?A: Only if it's pre-Bosch.


