

Two-cylinder "Boxer" Engine

While researching for the article on "Why the Chevron" some interesting facts about the Citroen 2CV engine came up. It was a rather small engine – under 400 ccs. It is a horizontally opposed 2 cylinder "boxer" engine. Of necessity the pistons move in opposite directions which does cause one problem. If the moved in the same direction it might introduce some "rock and roll" but if we look at the 4-stroke cycle – Input, compression, power and exhaust things are more clear-cut. Let us look at what would happen if the pistons moved in the same direction. Starting with the left hand side on the input stroke. The right would be either compression or exhaust. Lets look at the two possibilities.

Left $I \subset \underline{P} \in I \subset \underline{P} \in I \dots$ Right(A) $C \underline{P} \in I \subset \underline{P} \in I \dots$ Right(B) $E \mid C \underline{P} \in I \subset \underline{P} \dots$

In both possibilities there are two power strokes in a row – unworkable. Even more rock and roll.






So what does pistons moving in opposite directions do? In a "normal" engine some pistons are moving up, some down.

Air can move from below one piston to below another. In a two cylinder boxer engine this cannot happen so the crankcase volume changes a lot with implications for pressure. High pressure in a crankcase is a big no-no, as it puts strain on oil seals and gaskets. The 2CV had a valve system to allow gases to escape – toward the engine air intake.

Interestingly the 2CV did not have a distributor – one less thing to go wrong. Timing was off the crankshaft and voltage was sent to both cylinder plugs at the same time when the pistons were near TDC, igniting fuel in the compression stroke and doing nothing in the exhaust stroke. This is known "wasted spark". See Below


The section of those regulations which affects our club is **Part 3 - Model Rules - Schedule 4.**


Citroen - Why the Chevron(s)? Part 3






This time we reveal the answer which is **gears**

Earliest gears were straight cut spur gears which are simple to make but are very noisy. Changing gears in a car is also more difficult although in common use in race cars. Helical or spiral gears were invented and reduced noise but a new problem – axial or sideways load arose. In large situations like flour milling or ships this load is very hard to control.



In a visit to Poland in 1900 Andre Citroën visited a small mechanical company that had developed a machine for cutting gears with herringbone teeth in wood. These could then be used in sand moulds. Normally very difficult to make. These gears were mainly used by flour and spinning mills, these overcome the axial load problem because one half pushes left, the other right.. Citroen had the rights to manufacture them in France and when his company branched out into cars he used two herringbone teeth as his car symbol - still used today even if a bit stylised.




Brainteasers
