### **Rob Roy Hillclimb**



Hillclimbing is a unique form of motorsport, with only one vehicle on the track at any time and the driver competing against the clock - or perhaps more importantly against themselves.

The vehicle must be just right and technique correct to shave a few hundredths of a second off their time.


The earliest recorded event appears to be one in France in 1897.

In Victoria it goes back to at least 1904 with a Burgundy Street, Heidelberg Hill Climb. Victorian Governor Reg Talbot, driving a Talbot, was a participant. At that time hillclimbing was a genteel affair with people dressing up, cars often taking passengers, and afternoon tea being served.

Hillclimbing was also popular in England, where there are a couple of different types of hillclimb events. One is where classic cars try to climb a muddy hill, often with passengers bouncing up and down trying to gain traction. Here the main aim seems to be to actually get to the finish line without sliding back down the hill. Perhaps club social events with few spectators.

To distinguish the types of event, the English sometimes refer to the type we are familiar with as "speed hill climbs". For this type, an example of a very old purpose built facility is the track at Shelsley Walsh, run by the Midlands Automobile Club and dating back to 1905. It is the oldest motorsport venue in the world today still using the same track.

Another famous English venue is the Bugatti Owners track at Prescott. They purchased the land in 1937 and the first event was held a year later. Stirling Moss was a competitor here in 1948 and it is still used regularly.



#### **Rob Roy**

The Rob Roy track is of similar age to Prescott.

In the 1930s the Light Car Club of Victoria was looking for a suitable venue. They had discussions with Bill Clinton who had been a mayor of Heidelberg and was perhaps familiar with hillclimbing.

He had the Rob Roy Shetland pony stud at Christmas Hills/ Smiths Gully some 35km north-east of Melbourne. Here he also developed "Clinton's Pleasure Grounds". This was partly designed for employers to take their workers out for a picnic (not much chance of that these days). It was open to the public at weekends and had a swimming hole, sports facilities, tea rooms and a dance hall. The chimneys that remain at Rob Roy are probably from that era.



The Light Car Club of Victoria developed a track there with the first event (on gravel) held in 1937and won by Peter Whitehead from the United Kingdom in an ERA (English Racing Automobiles).

It was sealed soon after, making it the second oldest and one of only three sealed purpose built tracks in the world, with Prescott and Shelsley Walsh.

In January 1962 bushfires ravaged the area and with repairs too expensive the site was abandoned.

In the meantime - since 1951 - a track had been established at Templestowe.



From 1979 to 1987 the MG Car Club ran events there. However a decision by the owner of the land to subdivide soon put an end to that.

Some MGCC members managed to acquire the large PBR (Patons Brake Replacement) brake shoes that featured as the start gate. The Club negotiated with Eltham Shire and the Board of Works who now controlled the site with a view to resurrect Rob Roy.

A great deal of voluntary work was done by club members over the next 12 months (and since) to restore the track. The PBR shoes now grace the start line.

Many famous racing drivers have competed at Rob Roy, including Harry Firth, Len Lukey, Lex Davidson, Bib Stillwell, Jack Brabham, Norm Beechey, and Peter Brock, who as a guest of honour in a demonstration run created an unofficial class record of 23.76 seconds in a Holden Torana GTR-XU1.

#### Modern Day

The MGCC continues to manage the site with a long term lease and the track has recently been resealed. Events are held regularly, some by other car clubs. Perhaps the event of most interest to BCHAC is the 2-day 'Rob Roy Revival' held in early March. This year all vehicles were pre mid-50s and were driven with much enthusiasm. If you are interested in a pleasant day out this would be a good choice.




